## Final Lesson – Location and Place

Give students 8.5x11 aerial image of Darrington (10 minutes)

Draw "self" into image

On the back of the image have students write the following:

- What they can see from the ground level where they are at (have them pick direction like Google Street Map)
- 2. What they can hear on a Spring day at that location
- 3. What they smell on a Spring day at that location
- 4. Why they chose that location

On the front image, have students identify an important place in town

On the back of the page write the following:

- 1. What they can see from the ground level where they are at (have them pick direction like Google Street Map)
- 2. Why they chose that location
- 3. How can this important place be maintained for future generations?

## Get login info from school

Have students log into ArcGIS online school account. (30 minutes)

Open New Map

Save as: Name - (Student1/Student2\_InclassMap)

Search Darrington, WA

Zoom into school

Have student add Map Notes

Students create a map of the school campus tracing with polygon and freehand edit tools

- Students should create individual features (examples: buildings, playgrounds, fields, parking lots)
- Have students name each feature and color symbology
- Save map when completed

Teachers can download maps at a later time and print for students' assignments

Take students outside to covered play area or large parking lot if play area not available (50 minutes)

Geomentor draws an approximate 5' x 10' polygon (or 2) in white sidewalk chalk then selects area to place "lake" or "stream" (draw in blue)

Have students talk through planning process to zone and map a new town

Students should place and draw the following:

• Neighborhoods (Residential zones in yellow)

- Services and businesses (Commercial Zones in red)
- Resource processing and manufacturing (Industrial Zones in purple)
- Parks and trails (in green)
- Conservation area (hatching overlay since it can be located in any zone), select from the following:
  - o Riverside or lakeside area
  - Forest area
  - o Dedicated farmland
