Ms. Rusko,

As a long term resident of Gleneagle who has raised two children in ASD and is also very involved in the community as a family, I am quite concerned about the possibility of the addition of a hot dip galvanizing plant across the street from not only Gleneagle but the huge apartment complex that was approved at the 67th entrance. You do realize that there is an elementary and middle school bus stop right at that 67th pond entrance? That means children will be exposed to those fumes at least twice a day! They, the new apartment complex and the houses with the closest proximity to 67th are already exposed to hemp plant fumes all day, every day from the plant farm that was approved.

Our neighborhood is already up in arms over the approval of the apartments at our pond entrance with, again, ZERO improvements to getting in and out of our neighborhood. Adding Amazon, etc in traffic on 172nd with no road improvements was extremely short sighted, as well as the hundreds of apartments on the corner of 172nd & 67th. I'm truly worried about the vision or lack thereof, that our city and county officials seem to have. Your paramount job is to protect our community. Whatever jobs or tax income that might be made isn't even close to equal to the probability of health implications if this goes through. What is the likelihood of the wind blowing this towards the Boys & Girls Club and all those outdoor fields that are used constantly??

The fact that this wasn't dismissed out of hand is probably the most disturbing part of all. Please do the right thing. Do not make the community rally together around something that undermines our confidence in the local government even more.
