



211TH PLACE CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENTS

Key messages/FAQ

Date: January 5, 2023

What is happening?

The City will be making roadway improvements to the 211th Place corridor from SR 530 to 67th Ave NE. In addition to roadway rehabilitation for freight and vehicle movement, the project will include a grade separated 12-ft wide multi use path for bicyclists and pedestrians, ADA compliant curb ramps, street amenities such as artwork and landscaping, and street lighting. The intersection at 67th Ave will also be improved to allow for wider truck turning movements.

Why are these improvements needed?

This corridor is over fifty years old and not originally designed and constructed to accommodate the large volume of freight, passenger vehicles and ped/bike travel that it sees today. Not only is 211th Place showing its age with failing pavement and lack of pedestrian walkways, the roadway embankment has eroded, causing settlement in the roadway.

What do the improvements aim to do?

The improvements aim to provide a corridor that will meet the current and future needs of the entire community.

What is the estimated project cost?

Engineer's Estimate: \$3.3 Million

How is the project funded?

The 211th Corridor project will be funded by a \$2.3 million grant from the Transportation Improvement Board (TIB) in addition to City of Arlington Utility funds and Transportation Improvement Funds.

What is the project schedule? (Estimated completion)

The project is scheduled to begin the design phase in 2023 with an estimated construction start in summer 2024.

How will the project be constructed?

At this time, a project outline is not available.

What should I expect during construction?

During construction, please expect delays in travel times with lane shifts and detours during construction hours. Please allow for extra time in your schedule and be cautious of workers in the construction area.
